SECTION A — NARCISSI

Narcissi Classification

Division 1, Trumpet:	Corona (“cup”) is as long as, or longer than the perianth segments (“petals”)
Division 2, Large Cupped:	Corona (“cup”) is more than one third of, but less than equal to the length of the perianth segments (“petals”)
Division 3, Small Cupped:	Corona (“cup”) is not more than one third of the length of the perianth segments (“petals”)
Division 4, Double:	One or more flowers to a stem with doubling of the perianth (“petals”) or the corona (“cup”) or both
Bunch Flowered:	Two or more flowers on the stem

Colour abbreviation is as follows:

W = WHITE, Y = YELLOW, P = PINK, O = ORANGE, R = RED

EXAMPLE: 1W – Y is Division 1, White Perianth, Yellow Cup

NOVICE CLASSES

Restricted to exhibitors who have been showing daffodils for 5 years or less, subject to the discretion of the Show Committee.

1. Division 1, any trumpet variety, 1 bloom
2. Division 2, any large cupped variety, 1 bloom
3. Division 3, any small cupped variety, 1 bloom
4. Division 4, any double variety, 1 bloom
5. Any other Division, 1 stem
6. Division 1, 3 blooms, may be mixed, 1 vase
7. Division 2, 3 blooms, may be mixed, 1 vase
8. Division 3, 3 blooms, may be mixed, 1 vase
9. Division 4, 3 blooms, may be mixed, 1 vase
10. Any other Division, 3 stems, may be mixed, 1 vase
11. Bunch flowered, 3 stems, may be mixed, 1 vase
12. 1 pot, any size, miniature, one variety
13. 1 pot, any size, other than miniature, one variety.

AMATEUR CHAMPIONSHIP OF IRELAND
Awarded to the highest placed amateur in Class 14

14. Twelve varieties representing at least 3 divisions. One stem of each. Each bloom to be staged singly.

27. Sub - division 2Y - R or O - R, 1 bloom
28. Sub - division 2W - R or W - O, 1 bloom
29. Sub - division 2W - P, 1 bloom
30. Sub-division 2W – Y, 1 bloom

60. ROCK GARDEN PLANTS., 1 pot or pan not exceeding 9".
61. BOWL OF CUT FLOWERS OF ALPINES, arrangement not to exceed 12" in width or 9" in height.
62. CACTI, 3, each different, pots or pans not exceeding 6".
63. CACTI, 3, each different, pots or pans not exceeding 3".
64. CACTUS, 1, in pot or pan.
65. SUCCULENTS, 2, each different, pots or pans not exceeding 6".

67. VIOLA, 1 container of 6 stems, may be mixed, container supplied by society.

73. HARDY BULBOUS PLANTS, 1 pot not exceeding 12".
74. ANY FOLIAGE POT PLANT.
75. BEDDING WALLFLOWERS, 1 vase, 6 stems, may be mixed.
76. CAMELIA, 3 blooms, floating in bowl to be supplied by exhibitor.
77. ANY OTHER POT PLANT IN BLOOM.

RULES FOR EXHIBITORS

1. All exhibits must be the bona fida production of the exhibitor.
2. The Society provides vases, bowls, containers and paper plates.
3. When staging, exhibitors should obtain, from the Show Secretary, envelopes containing their class cards. A class card must be placed face down in front of the exhibit to which it relates.
4. The Show will be organised and judged as set out in “The Horticultural Show Handbook”, RHS, ISBN 0 874 431 98 1. Floral Art classes will be judged in accordance with NAFAS Competitions Manual 3rd Edition, 2015.
5. The decision of the Judges shall be final as to merit but an objection on other points may be lodged, in writing, with the Show Secretary before 4 p.m..
6. All exhibits should be named as correctly as possible.
7. Exhibits must be arranged on the space allocated and must remain where placed until the close of the show, which is 5.00 p.m. on Sunday 15th April.
8. Exhibitors may make a maximum of 2 entries per class.
9. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry or entries.
10. The Society will not, in any way, be responsible for loss or damage to any exhibit or the property of any exhibitor before, during or after the Show.
11. Exhibitors, other than those in the Juvenile and Cookery Sections, must be aged 15 or over on the date of the Show.
12. Prizes will be awarded to the first and second places in each class.
13. Judges may withhold prizes where insufficient merit is shown.
